■ SUPREME COURT'S 4-4 RULING ON IMMIGRATION


Supreme Court ruling disappoints, but doesn't deter immigration advocates .

With the words of Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. -- "The arc of the moral universe is long, but it bends towards justice" -- and St. Junipero Serra -- "Siempre adelante, nunca atras" (Always forward, never back) -- Msgr. Antonio Valdivia offered encouragement to immigrants and their champions dismayed by the Supreme Court's 4-4 ruling on immigration, announced June 23.

The ruling in *United States v. Texas* dealt a blow to those pinning their hopes on Deferred Action for Parents of Americans and Lawful Permanent Residents (DAPA), and an expansion of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA).

"The Supreme Court is not the final word," Msgr. Valdivia said. Maria Elvia Martinez Alvarez and Rafael Hernandez, with their American-born daughter Janette, received a blessing from Msgr. Valdivia and the Very Rev. Jay Matthews, rector of the Cathedral of Christ the Light, in a chapel of the cathedral.

Catholic Charities of the East Bay, which provides low-cost immigration services, estimates the court's action affects 80,000 people living in the East Bay. Among them are the parents who came to the cathedral to tell their story. Martinez Alvarez said she left Mexico because of the dangers there. People coming to the United States, she said, "don't come in to do crime; they want better opportunities for their families." Active in her children's schools and her San Leandro parish, she said, "I do my best for my community." Her activism includes marshaling forces of mothers to



help students who are not performing up to standards, to improve their work.

"We're still dealing with a broken immigration system," said Christopher Martinez, chief program director of Catholic Charities of the East Bay, who called the court's action -- or inaction -- "tremendously disappointing." The message he is taking to the Catholic Charities clients is "don't lose hope, and keep the fight alive."

With the court's rebuff of President Barack Obama's executive order,

Martinez said, "It's time for Congress to do something on immigration." He is also encouraging interested people to lobby Congress and also to "lobby locally" by attending town hall meetings offered by elected officials. For Martinez and his co-workers at Catholic Charities, "our work is going to intensify," he said.

■ **THE EUCHARIST AND SOCIAL JUSTICE
 BODY OF CHRIST, BROKEN FOR THE
 POOR**

Pope Saint John Paul II understood the direct connection between our universal celebration of the Eucharist and our taking action to help those in need. The Eucharist changes bread and wine; it also changes us. It has a transformative power and potential for personal and global transformation. The Eucharist provides spiritual food which empowers us in our Christian lives. Not only does the Eucharist call us to action, it nourishes us and strengthens us in virtue so that we can carry out the Church's mission in the world: the mission of justice.

How does it do this? In three movements: it draws us together inclusively; it forms us into a new body, a new social reality we understand as the Body of Christ; and finally, transformed, it releases us outwards in the mission of *caritas*, which is solidarity and justice. Let's look at each of these briefly.

We experience the Eucharist as a community, as a unified community healed of divisions. We approach as individuals, but we never really worship alone. Pope Saint John Paul II said, "A truly Eucharistic community cannot be closed in upon itself." It challenges us to recognize our place within a community and the human family throughout the world. Pope Benedict XVI said, "It is by receiving the Body of Christ that we receive the strength of unity with God and with one another."

But this unity is for a purpose: with her social doctrine, the Church aims at helping all people on the path of salvation. This is her primary and sole purpose. And so the Eucharist is both social (life-affirming) and just (giving due to what is right and just) and thus is the key to our identity as a Eucharistic people. The Eucharist awakens us to our own dignity and to that of others.

Then he took the bread, said the

blessing, broke it, and gave it to them, saying, "This is my body, which will be given up for you..." These words point to the greatest theological virtue, *caritas*, also known as charity or love. *Caritas* is the theological backbone of Catholic Social Teaching. Without love, there is no true justice. In the Eucharistic encounter with Christ's love for us, and realizing our own deep needs, we become sensitized to all who suffer. Their reality becomes a reality for us. As St. Augustine said, "The pain of one, even the smallest member, is the pain of all."

Thus the Eucharist moves us and inspires us to respond. Drawn into the dynamic of Christ's self-giving, we are moved to self-giving action in solidarity with all members of the human family who face injustice. In the Eucharistic encounter, we are challenged to recognize and confront the human structures of injustice, including racism, poverty, violence, exploitation, and all other systemic violations of human life and dignity.

Finally, the Eucharist prepares us for mission and propels us forward to

transform the world. Made new in Christ, we belong to no one, no thing, no principle, no ideology; we belong only to Christ and His Body, no longer enslaved to sin and division. This is solidarity at its heart.

But in the outward expression, the Eucharistic encounter is not over. As we warm to our mission of justice, of the Kingdom, we begin to realize that we do not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. This Word is Christ, the true Bread of Life. When we join in solidarity with the homeless, the poor, the forgotten, the mentally ill, and those who are alone, we continue to be fed by Christ present in each person and we honor Him. In that moment of solidarity, we are in his presence. Christ says to us, “Whatever you did for one of these least of mine, you did for me.”

Thus the Eucharist “plants a seed of living hope in our daily commitment to the work before us,” challenging us to live “Eucharistic” lives. Filled with awe for all we have received in Christ’s self-gift, we respond with service and works of justice to others informed *by caritas*. We live our Christian vocation: Body of Christ, broken for the poor.

■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY –
July 3, 2016
Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Last Sunday, Jesus rebuked James and John for wanting to “call down fire from heaven” (Luke 9:54-55) on an unwelcoming town. As he sends forth disciples today, Jesus again for-

bids retaliation against non-receptive listeners (10:10-11), showing us how to be Jesus’ “missionaries of mercy” this Jubilee Year of Mercy. Like the first disciples, we are sent not to proclaim ourselves but Jesus. As Jesus sent them in pairs, so are we also to work together in the community of the Church. We often describe the Church as Isaiah describes Jerusalem in today’s first reading, our comforting, nurturing Mother (Isaiah 66:13). So, going forth gently, like lambs among wolves (Luke 10:3), we share comforting peace, nurturing food and drink (Luke’s image for Eucharist), and Jesus’ healing promise of unfailing, unconditional mercy (10:5, 7, 9). Thus Jesus bids us proclaim the kingdom of God by showing what God’s kingdom looks like in action. “Go, preach the Gospel,” Pope Francis’ saintly namesake of Assisi is said to have instructed his first friars, “and when necessary, use words!”



■ **AÑO JUBILAR DE LA MISERICORDIA**
Décimo Cuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario



El domingo pasado, Jesús reprendió a Santiago y Juan por querer “descender fuego del cielo” (Lucas 9:54-55) en una ciudad inhóspita. Hoy, Jesús envía nuevamente a sus discípulos, y les prohíbe represalias contra los oyentes no receptivos (10:10 – 11), y los muestra cómo “Misioneros de la misericordia” en este Año Jubilar de la Misericordia.

Igual que los primeros discípulos, nosotros estamos enviados a proclamar a Jesús. Y así como Jesús los envió en parejas, nosotros estamos llamados a trabajar juntos en la comunidad de la Iglesia. A menudo se describe la Iglesia como Isaías describe a Jerusalén en la primera lectura de hoy, nuestra Madre reconfortante, enriquecedora (Isaías 66:13). Por lo tanto, avancemos suavemente, como corderos entre lobos (Lucas 10:3), compartamos la paz que reconforta, cultivemos alimentos y bebidas (imagen de Lucas para la Eucaristía) y la promesa de que la misericordia de Jesús inagotable e incondicional nos curará (10:5, 7, 9).

Jesús nos ordena proclamar el Reino de Dios, mostrándolo con acciones. “Ir, predicar el Evangelio,” al igual que el Papa Francisco quien nos dice que San Francisco de Asís mando a sus primeros frailes a proclamar a Jesús con acciones “¡y cuando sea necesario, usen palabras!

- ” 2 fotos (para pasaporte estadounidense).
- ” Una lista de todos sus viajes fuera de EEUU, incluyendo fechas de salida y regreso. **(Vea el reverso)** ↔
- ” Una lista de sus domicilios, empleos y/o escuelas durante los últimos cinco años, incluyendo fechas de inicio a fin **(Vea el reverso)** ↔
- ” Si actualmente está casado/a: los datos de su cónyuge, incluyendo su nombre completo, fecha de nacimiento, número de residencia (A #), fecha y lugar de naturalización y su domicilio actual.
